God's ear is indeed bent low towards the prayers of children.

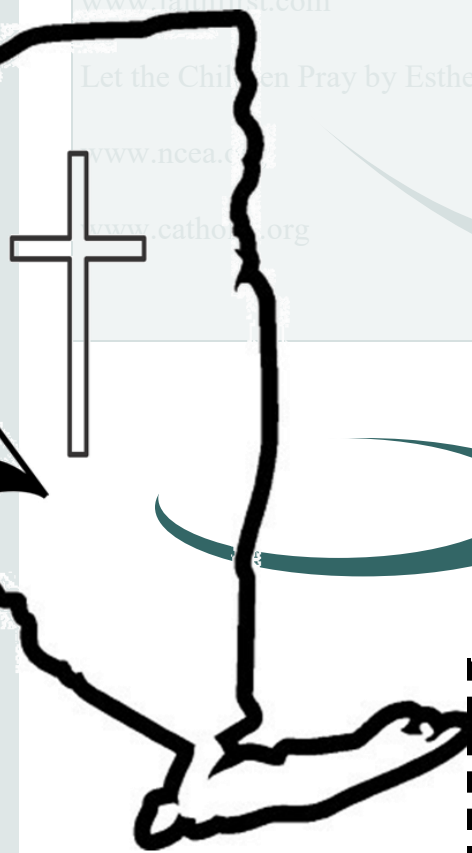
