PROJECT SAVE (Safe Schools Against Violence in Education Act)

On July 24, 2000 Governor Pataki signed into law Project SAVE. The Legislation provides a broad context within which school districts must address the critical issues of safety and security. Full compliance by the public school districts will be completed by July 1, 2001. Many of the provisions are already in place in our schools such as codes of conduct; instruction in civility, citizenship, and character education and basic principles such as honesty, tolerance, personal responsibility and respect for others. Complete regulations are being developed by The Department of Education and will be submitted to the Board of Regents for approval in November and December 2000. One important provision for you to note is that "Candidates applying for teacher certification on or after February 2, 2001 must complete two hours of coursework or training in school violence prevention and intervention."

Once again CSAANYS will take care of group registrations to the NCEA convention to be held in Milwaukee, WI April 17-20, 2001.

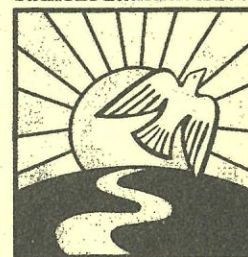
